Argentine eighth seed Juan Martin del Potro, a semi-finalist in 2009 and 2018, made the second round with a 3-6, 6-2, 6-1, 6-4 win over Chilean world number 58 Nicolas Jarry.

Canada's Bianca Andreescu, the surprise champion at Indian Wells, marked her Roland Garros debut by beating Marie Bouzkova of the Czech Republic 5-7, 6-4, 6-4.

Croatian Karlovic, the tallest player on the tour at 6ft 11in (2.11m), defeated Lopez 7-6 (7/4), 7-5, 6-7 (7/9), 7-5.

In the late evening clash on Tuesday, Reigning champion Simona Halep started her title defence with an ultimately comfortable victory on Tuesday despite a second-set blip against Australian Ajla Tomljanovic.

The Romanian was pegged back on Court Philippe Chatrier but raced through the decider to win 6-2, 3-6, 6-1. Halep, seeded third, will face Poland's Magda Linette in the second round.

England's Alves set to replace Neymar as Brazil captain

India returns to the Olympics

India's Lakra has been named captain for the upcoming tournament as Hockey India announced the awaited 18-member squad. The 26-year-old Ramandeep will be leading India's forward-line along with Deep Singh, Gursahibjit Singh, Jeet Singh and Akashdeep Singh. Experienced goalkeeper PR Sreejesh and Ishan B Pathak will defend the team.

Ramandeep, Lakra, Surender Varun Kumar, Amit Rohidas and Rinder Singh will form India's defense, while the midfield will see Deep playing a key role along with others Hardik Singh, Vivek Sagar, Sumit and Nilakanta Sharma. They have been grouped in Pool A with Russia, Poland and Iran while Japan, Mexico, USA and Africa are grouped in Pool B. India will begin their campaign on May 29 against Russia and will be aiming high at the top in order to make the Olympic qualifying event, which will be held later this year.
