India holds '2+2' Ministerial dialogue with US

India and the US on Friday took stock of their strong defence ties during bilateral talks between Defence Minister Rajnath Singh and his counterpart Lloyd Austin. He said the two countries will co-produce an infantry combat vehicle as part of defence industrial cooperation. Giving details of the talks, defence ministry officials said the two Ministers comprehensively discussed a wide range of defence and strategic issues. There was particular focus on enhancing defence industrial cooperation and getting the defence industries from both sides together

to cooperatively co-develop and co-produce defence systems. The Ministers explored ways and means to advance their defence technology cooperation with joint research in critical areas. They reviewed the progress of the India-US Defence Industrial Ecosystem, IDIUS-X, which was launched in June this year and aims to expand the strategic technology partnership and defence industrial cooperation between the governments, businesses and academic institutions of India and US. Secretary Austin welcomed India's decision to elevate to full membership of the Combined Maritime Forces, a multilateral construct headquartered in Bahrain.



Rajnath symbolically handed over to Secretary Austin some items recovered in Assam as part of the US Defence POW MIA Accounting Agency Mission. The items include parts of parachute, uniform and airplane of the US forces from the World War II-era. The Ministers, before concluding, drew up an agenda for future joint work for the teams. Talking to reporters after the '2+2' defence and foreign ministerial dialogue, Austin said, "We are working together to co-produce an armoured vehicle and that is extremely important." In a question, he said the talks covered a wide range of issues including the rising security challenges from China. At the same time, he said the

US-India relationship is not just about challenges that China presents but it is based on shared values between the two countries. Asked about the project under which India will procure 31 MQ-9B drones from the US, Austin said it will be announced at the right time. Officials in the government are doing everything possible to make sure that India gets that capability as quickly as possible, he said. We are stepping up US-India defence activities in multiple domains — from space to under sea, Austin said. We exchanged views on major developments in Indo-Pacific region, Middle East and Ukraine, he said. Austin said the US-India cooperation is stronger than ever.

Parliament panel reports on Bills to replace criminal laws submitted

Be in sync with technological advancements, adopt modern practices: Army Chief to MES

Army Chief General Manoj Pandey has urged the Military Engineer Services (MES) to endeavour to be in sync with the technological advancements happening in the industry and adopt modern construction methods. He said this in his address at a two-day engineer conclave on infrastructure development and sustenance held on November 8 and 9 at the Manekshaw Centre at Delhi Cantonment, it was learnt. Pandey addressed a gathering of about 550 officials from the Army, Navy, Air Force and Coast Guard, MES, and representatives from the construction industry, academia and research organisations, and subject experts, including eminent technologies like 3D construction, precast methods, cold climate concreting, underground storage, automation tools, net zero buildings, green norms and contract management. The speakers included industry experts on various subjects, pioneers in green norms on geo-thermal projects, industry litigators, contract managers, and subject experts, sources said. The event, in Chief Lt General Arvind Walia while delivering the welcome address, reiterated the national mood in developing infrastructure and the role of the MES in nation-building, being one of the largest construction agencies in the country. He elaborated on the time-cost-quality paradigm and the plans of the MES to optimise the balance between the three aspects. The event, as marked the beginning of a series of such interactions, so as to make the organisation more contemporary and effective, they said. Speakers from various fields spoke on pertinent construction

Ramp up healthcare preparations to deal with pollution-triggered patient rush: Centre to 4 States

amid soaring levels of toxic air in the national Capital, the Union Health Ministry has issued a comprehensive advisory asking Delhi and its neighbouring States to strengthen the healthcare system to deal with any rush of patients triggered by poor air quality that may worsen in the upcoming festive season. In a letter to the health departments of Delhi, Haryana, Punjab, Uttar Pradesh and Rajasthan this week, Director General of Health Services (DGHS) Atul Goel also asked schools and students to take proactive measures to combat the escalating pollution crisis including promoting bicycle usage among higher-grade students. Ensuring proper ventilation in classrooms and advocating for 'wet mopping' of floors are among the other measures suggested to enhance indoor air quality, said the letter. Goel reminded that air pollution not only accounts for acute illnesses but also precipitates exacerbation of chronic illnesses of respiratory, cardiovascular and cerebrovascular systems. In fact, RMI hospital in Delhi and JJ hospital in Mumbai have already set up 'pollution' wards to handle health problems such as asthma, chronic inflammatory lung disease and dry coughs triggered by toxic air. In a bid to reduce emissions, the advisory suggests the adoption of electric cars and public

India, Bangladesh Navies exercise ends on Friday after three days

The 4th edition of bilateral exercise between Indian Navy and Bangladesh Navy, BONGOSAGAR-23, and the 5th edition of Coordinated Patrol (CORPAT) by the two navies was conducted in the Northern Bay of Bengal for three ending Thursday, officials said here on Friday. Giving details of the drills, they said ships and aircraft from both navies undertook joint patrolling along the International Maritime Boundary Line (IMBL), and subsequently conducted maritime exercises to enhance interoperability. Indian Navy ships Kuthar, Kiltan and Maritime Patrol Aircraft (MPA) Dornier participated in the exercise along with Bangladesh Navy Ships Bangl, Abu Ubaidah and MPA. The ships undertook communication drills, surface gun-shots, tactical manoeuvres and other exercises that culminated with a steam race. The CORPAT-23 also included the maiden Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster Relief (HADR) drills conducted between the two navies wherein a Search and Rescue exercise was exercised. Regular bilateral exercises and coordinated patrols have strengthened mutual understanding and cooperation between the two navies.

World gets its first chikungunya vaccine Ixchiq

The world has got the first chikungunya vaccine, known as Ixchiq which has been approved by the US Food and Drug Administration (FDA) for individuals 18 years of age and older who are at increased risk of exposure to mosquito-borne virus. Valeneva Austria GmbH, a biotechnology company in Vienna, Austria is the manufacturer of the vaccine. Containing a live, weakened version of the chikungunya-causing virus, Ixchiq is administered as a single dose by injection into the muscle and may cause symptoms in the recipient similar to those experienced by people having the viral disease, the FDA said in a statement. "Infection with chikungunya virus can lead to

severe disease and prolonged health problems, particularly for older adults and individuals with underlying medical conditions," said Peter Marks, director of the FDA's Center for Biologics Evaluation and Research. "Today's approval addresses an unmet medical need and is an important advancement in the prevention of a potentially debilitating disease with limited treatment options," said Marks. The effectiveness of the vaccine was determined through a clinical study in individuals 18 years of age and older in the US, the agency's statement said. The level of antibody generated in the 266 vaccinated participants was "based on a level shown to be protective in non-human primates that had received blood from people who had been vaccinated", it said.

Working under sun causes 1 in 3 deaths from skin cancer: Study

Working under the sun causes nearly one in three deaths from non-melanoma skin cancer, according to an international study including researchers from the World Health Organization (WHO) and the International Labour Organization (ILO). They found that outdoor workers carry a large and increasing burden of non-melanoma skin cancer, which refers to a group of cancers that develop in the upper layers of the skin. The condition "rarely heals but surgical treatment is painful and often disfiguring," according to the WHO. The research estimated that in 2019, 1.6 billion people of working age (15 years or older) were exposed to solar ultraviolet radiation while working outdoors, roughly 28 per cent of all working-age people. Further, in that year alone, working outdoors in the sun caused almost 19,000 deaths across 183 countries from non-melanoma skin cancer, about 65 per cent of which were in men, the study published in the journal Environment International said. From the research, the WHO called for more action to protect workers from hazardous outdoor work in the sunlight. As skin cancer develops after years or even decades of exposure, workers must be protected from solar ultraviolet radiation at work from young working age onwards, the WHO said in a statement. "Unprotected exposure to solar ultraviolet radiation is a major cause of occupational skin cancer," said Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus, WHO Director-General. In this study, the researchers found that the occupational hazard of "exposure to solar ultraviolet radiation" had the third highest attributable burden of cancer deaths globally. Between 2000 and 2019, skin cancer deaths attributable to occupational exposure to sunlight almost doubled, increasing by 88 per cent from 10,088 deaths in 2000 to roughly 19,000 deaths in 2019, the study found.

I&B Ministry invites comments on Broadcasting Services (Regulation) Bill

Union Ministry of Information and Broadcasting on Friday invited comments on the Broadcasting Services (Regulation) Bill, 2023. The Cable Television Networks (Regulation) Act of 1995 has been in effect for three decades, serving as the primary legislation overseeing content in linear broadcasting, including cable networks. However, the broadcasting landscape has undergone significant changes in the interim. Technological advances have introduced new content such as IPTV, OTT, and various integrated models. With the digitisation of broadcasting sector, especially in cable TV, there is a growing need to streamline the regulatory framework. This involves ensuring ease of doing business and enhancing adherence to the Programme Code and Advertisement Code by the broadcasters and Distribution Platform Operators. Recognising the need for a more cohesive approach, the existing fragmented regulatory framework is required to be replaced with a new, comprehensive law. Ministry of Information and Broadcasting has invited comments from industry stakeholders. India has proposed a draft Broadcasting Services (Regulation) Bill, 2023. The draft Bill provides for a consolidated framework to regulate the broadcasting services in the country and seeks to integrate the existing Cable Television Networks (Regulation) Act, 1995 and other Policy Guidelines currently governing the broadcasting sector in the country. The Bill streamlines regulatory processes, extends its purview to cover the Over-the-Top (OTT) content and introduces contemporary definitions and provisions for emerging technologies. It seeks to provide for Content Evaluation Committees and a Broadcast Advisory Council for self-regulation, different program advertisement code for different Broadcasting Network Operators. Accessibility measures for persons with disabilities, and statutory penalties, etc. The Bill comprises of Six sections and 48 Sections and three Schedules. The key highlights includes Consolidation and Modernization to address a long standing need of consolidating and updating the regulatory provisions for various broadcasting services under a single legislative framework. This move streamlines the regulatory process, making it more efficient and contemporary. It extends its regulatory purview to encompass broadcasting over-the-top (OTT) content and digital news and current affairs currently regulated through IT Act, 2000 and regulations made there under. Another key step is Contemporary Definitions and Future-Ready Provisions to keep pace with the evolving technologies and services, the bill introduces comprehensive definitions for contemporary broadcasting technologies and incorporates provisions for emerging broadcasting technologies.
